

JANET FAIRBAIRN FOR VICE PRESIDENT

Hello my name is Janet Fairbairn, I have been a Laboratory Technologist for 35 years and I am employed at CancerCare Manitoba. Being part of the labour movement is very important to me as I have served as a member advocate for as long as I can remember, advocating for my peers. My experience includes being part of the MAHCP Executive Council for several years, participating on many of the committees including: Communication, Social Action, Management and Governance. We are the front line and the best chance for the patient to feel whole again. In these times of uncertainty the message needs to be that our union is fighting for their rights.

The other thing I am sure of is there is no greater time for solidarity than now. We must and I cannot stress this enough stick together, not only within our own union but with all other unions as well. The current government has not learned from the past and they need to know that we will not take this without a fight. I always refer back to the Winnipeg General Strike where things were at their worst yet with the support of all unions, the citizens of Winnipeg against all odds, won their fight and set the trend for many of the things we take for granted like the 40 hour work week, weekends off and safety rules. The Government is trying to erode these things that were fought for. If you feel I am type of person you want representing you, vote for me for Vice President and together we will win this cause.
