You may have seen media coverage around Dynacare's strike mandate and we know one of the first questions you may have is why aren't we voting to strike?

Dynacare members are at a very different stage in their bargaining. They already rejected a tentative agreement in May 2022. The employer came back with a final offer that was no better than the tentative agreement members had already rejected, and so the membership took a strike vote to send an even stronger message to the employer.

Your central table bargaining committee will call a strike vote when a similar need arises, but we are not there yet.

As for Dynacare, they had accepted zeros in their last agreement, consistent with the government's unconstitutional wage-freeze legislation. Now they are standing up to demand a fair deal.

If negotiations with Dynacare fail and our 300+ members there go on strike, we will ask all MAHCP members to stand with them and show up for them.

We know that the government and all employers will be watching to see our strength.

Let's stand in solidarity and raise our voices together. We will show them what they can expect from MAHCP if over 6500 of our central table members go on strike.
